Howdy! Just a note to let you all know that limited space still remains for our Ninth Annual Sedona Conference on Complex Litigation, April 26-27, 2007, at the Sedona Hilton in Sedona, AZ. This year's complex litigation conference focuses on the Attorney-Client Privilege, and how to protect it. The Conference features an international faculty, including, inter alia, one federal district court judge, two magistrate judges, a justice from Canada, two U.K. attorneys, in-house counsel from Bell Canada and Eli Lilly and Company, Professor Arthur Miller, Matt Miner, the Republican Chief Counsel for Crime & Terrorism, Senate Committee on the Judiciary, Barry Sabin from the U.S. DOJ, and leading U.S. attorneys from both sides of the "V." The Conference Co-Chairs are Bob Owen from Fulbright & Jaworski and Ariana Tadler from Milberg Weiss. Topics to be addressed include:

- (1) the history and current health of the attorney-client privilege;
- (2) comparative approaches to the privilege in the U.S., U.K., Canada and the EU;
- (3) Proposed Rule of Evidence 502;
- (4) the proposed Attorney-Client Privilege Protection Act;
- (5) The Thompson/McNulty memoranda;
- (6) subpoenas and requests to lawyers to reveal Attorney-Client communications;
- (7) preparation of effective privilege logs in complex litigation;
- (8) privilege and work product protection in document production;
- (9) a Judicial viewpoints on privilege logs, in camera review, and cost-effective case management; and
- (10) a session on ethics: privilege, work product, and the discovery of expert witnesses.

The Conference is being held during peak tourist season in Sedona, so not only is there limited space left for conference registrants, the conference hotel is also rapidly filling up, especially on the weekend nights (for those who may wish to spend the weekend in Sedona - one of America's most beautiful travel destinations).
